What Is Your Risk?

- Breast Cancer is the most common cancer among women in the U.S.
- 252,710 women are expected to be diagnosed with breast cancer this year, and 40,000 of those cases will be fatal
- There are over 3 million survivors of breast cancer today in the U.S.



What young men and women need to know.

- Even if you're young.
- Even if you don't smoke.
- Even if you have no family history of cancer.
- Even if you exercise, eat right and watch your weight.
